Planting Guide and Tips

- Fill your watering can, bucket, or jug before you begin.
- Start planting at the back of the plot first. Then, work your way to avoid stepping on other plants.
- 1. Loosen the soil by digging down and around the area.
- 2. Dig out a hole equal to the depth of the plant
- 3. Pour water into the hole and let it drain. Do this until the water drains slowly, or up to 3 times.
- 4. Ease a part the roots of the plant, if they are compacted. Some roots might already be loose enough.
- 5. Plant to a depth that allows the plant's crown to lie at soil level. (*Only the roots should be buried, not the stem.*)
- 6. Backfill soil between the plant and hole. Gently firm the soil around the plug.
- 7. Water the base of plant and the area around it after installation to fill the soil air holes around the root systems. Don't worry, you cannot over water!
- 8. Use mulch sparingly. If you are mulching, ensure you use a material that is pollinator-friendly and leave a 2" perimeter that is bare ground around the stem of the plant to avoid root rot and disease.

Stand back and smile. You're done with this plant! Repeat until done....
