

Welcome to Lincoln's Conservation Lands and Trails

Your opportunity to use Lincoln's open space is accompanied by the responsibility to be a good steward to the land. Please help us by complying with the Lincoln Conservation Land Regulations. The following is only a summary.

- Lincoln features approx. 80 miles of trails on 2,400 acres of conservation land and private property. The Lincoln Land Conservation Trust and the Conservation Department work together to protect and manage this trail network for the enjoyment of its many users. People and pets must stay on marked trails to lessen impacts on wildlife habitat. Some of the trails are on private property, so if you are off the trail, or on an unmarked trail, you may be trespassing. Lincoln trails are blazed with yellow diamonds.
- Bicycle riding is permitted only on trails expressly marked for such use.
 - Riders must walk bikes through wet/muddy sections of trails.
 - Any bike outing involving 5 or more riders must obtain a Group Use Permit (see QR code below)
 - Bike riders must yield to all other trail users.
- Dog walkers must always carry a leash.
 - Dogs must be leashed or under voice control at all times.
 - Dogs must be leashed at parking areas & trailheads; Flints Pond Conservation Area; agricultural fields & ecologically sensitive areas as marked; and certain trails at Mt. Misery.
 - Dogs must be leashed (or held by collar) when approaching other trail users.
 - A maximum of 3 leashed dogs are allowed per person. Visitors with 2 or fewer dogs may unleash their dogs, except where leashes are expressly required.
 - Dog waste must be picked up and removed from property.
- Horseback riding is not permitted where marked and in any wet areas or other sensitive areas where a horse may cause damage to the trail or to public water supplies.
- Flint's Pond is Lincoln's main public water supply. No trespassing in the pond, on the ice, or on the pond shoreline.
- Practice Leave No Trace: no littering, picking fungus, plants, or flowers; no injuring vegetation or removing natural materials.
- No motorized vehicles or equipment are allowed on any town trails.
- No hunting, trapping or carrying firearms (even if unloaded).
- No swimming, camping, smoking, or using drones.
- A Group Use Permit is required for a group of 10 or more people, a group of 5 or more bikers, or a group of 5 or more horseback riders. See QR code below.
